- Deleting some outdated provisions regarding resignations.
- Updating and clarifying issues about membership fees.

- Updating who is (and is not) involved in the approval process.
- Updating when membership lapses on non-payment of annual fees.
- Removing some duplication of information.
- Clarifying issues relating to accessing the Register of Members.
