2022 AUSIT Victorian Branch AGM – Financial Statement

As official financial figures are released nationally at the national AGM, these figures are only indicative of our financial status at a Victorian branch level. For full details, please refer to the official financial report which will be made available in time for the National AGM.

In total, the Victorian branch generated a surplus of \$6,315.04 for the 2022-23 financial year. We expect that this figure will stay relatively stable in the coming financial year. This surplus will go into the national coffers as a contribution to the running costs of AUSIT in general.

The branch ran four paid PD events with good attendance numbers, resulting in both high income and net earnings. Introduction of opening some of the events to sponsorship also helped reduce cost. In addition to these paid events, several unpaid social events were hosted to help increase visibility and membership connection.

I will be stepping down as Branch Treasurer at the end of the year. It will be my pleasure to welcome a new Treasurer to the Victorian Branch Committee.

Our branch continues to have the second-highest numbers of members behind NSW with 699. We at the committee are hopeful that our social activities will continue to draw new members as well as volunteers to contribute to running the Branch.
